We will discuss our snare and bass program that has a strong jazz focus so pairing voice and instrument we can have a student jazz set with our singers. As well as share opportunities for opera singers and classical musicians with Harlem Collective.

Not able to attend the IMA Conference this year? No problem this workshop is available and streaming live from our website. If your HBCU would like your students to participate in this workshop, great! All you need to do is process your schools registration fee of \$99.99 and then you will receive workshop collateral material and a link to stream the workshop.

Harlem Collective invites HBCU students to participate in our internship program that brings two opera or operetta works to (8) universities for a three day production run. This seasons two productions will be William Grant Still's "Costaso" and "Highway One".

Students will participate in chorus, and chamber orchestra. Each fall and spring our internship program travels to (8) Historically Black College University with a full scale stage production. Students learn how to mount a production from start to finish.

- All board members are provided free access to all Harlem Collective's 2023 productions onstage and virtually.


